

Abstract

The aim of this study is to investigate Jordan Policy towards Palestine Liberation Organization from 1964 to 1971 , due to the fact this era is regarded as critical period in Arab World history for the emergence of Arab Nationalism led by Nasirism and its Conflict with the West and Israel on Palestine issue , where Jordan has played crucial role in this struggle . 1964 is the date of P.L.O. founding , and 1971 is the time of P.L.O. departure from Jordan to Lebanon .

The Study is of four chapters as follow :

- The First Chapter studies Jordan Policy towards National Palestine Movement from 1921 to 1963 .
- The Second Chapter studies the political disagreements between Jordan and P.L.O. from 1964 to 1967.
- The third Chapter examines the impact of 1967 June War on disputation between Jordan and P.L.O. from 1967 to 1970 .

The fourth Chapter studies the Political crises and confrontations between Jordan and P.L.O. 1970-1971 .

The study shows the dangerous scope represented by PLO on Jordan interior conditions , after P.L.O. transformation to militant organization , plus P.L.O. impact on Jordan foreign Policy , particularly with Arab World , where this had led to Jordan isolation due to its disagreement with P.L.O. , for it wanted to use power to liberate Palestine , whereas Jordan preferred diplomacy due to its weak capabilities in comparison with Israel , in addition to Jordan insistence on maintain good relation with U.S.A. and the West , for Jordan was Fully satisfied that such relation was the only guarantor to protect its Unity and independency in front of Israel danger . This Policy was totally opposed by P.L.O. , finally Jordan had launched war in July 1971 to out P.L.O. from Jordan, where new era had started in Jordanian Crown history.
